ADVISORY: Immunization Notices for Elementary Students

The Peterborough County-City Health Unit has started mailing **first notices** to parents/guardians of elementary school students born in 2007, 2008, and 2009 who are <u>OVERDUE</u> for immunizations required under *the Immunization of School Pupils Act (ISPA)*. The changes to *ISPA* include the addition of pertussis, meningococcal and varicella vaccines as per the Ontario Publicly Funded Immunization Schedule.

Immunization for this age group includes:

- a. one dose of Menjugate (Men C-C) vaccine on or after their first birthday (NOT Menactra, which is administered in school-based vaccine clinics for grade 7 students)
- b. two doses of MMR vaccine given at least one month apart and on or after their first birthday
- c. Pediacel (DTaP-IPV-Hib) given at 2, 4, 6 and 18 months of age as their primary series
- d. a Tdap-IPV booster given between 4 to 6 years of age
- e. Two doses of varicella given at 15 months and between 4 to 6 years of age

What can your office do to prepare?

- 1 Maintain a one month supply of routine vaccines in your office.
- 2. Be ready to receive calls requesting immunization information or to book appointments.
- 3. Ask parents/guardians to bring the **first notice** form to the appointment.
- 4. Check the front of the first notice to determine what is needed.
- 5. Send immunization information to the Health Unit by any of the following methods:
 - Complete and fax the *Please Notify* tear-off form to (705)743-2897 (if you require additional tear-off forms, please advise when ordering vaccine and we can include them with your order)
 - Complete and fax the **first notice** to the Health Unit (705)743-2897
 - Call the Health Unit (705)743-1000, ext. 139 to report the immunization and the date
 - Ask parent to call the Health Unit (705)743-1000, ext. 139 to report the immunization and the date
- 6. Take the opportunity to immunize with any additional vaccines that they are eligible for under the Ontario Publicly Funded Immunization Schedule. Those who are 4 to 6 years old may be due for their second MMR and a Tdap-IPV even though this might not be reflected in the **first notice** because they are not OVERDUE until 7 years old. Children born on or after the year 2000 are eligible for two doses of varicella vaccine.

Thanks to a combined effort, 92% of our <u>high-school students</u> now comply with *ISPA*, compared to 67% before the notification process began. We would like to thank all the healthcare providers in our area for their ongoing support to ensure we have a population that is immunized and protected from vaccine preventable diseases.
