### **Polio Travel Health Notice**

On May 5, 2014, the World Health Organization (WHO) declared the recent spread of poliovirus (polio) a public health emergency of international concern. They issued temporary polio vaccination recommendations to prevent further spread of the virus worldwide, to be reviewed after three months. These recommendations focus on countries exporting wild polio and other polio-affected countries: Afghanistan, Cameroon, Equatorial Guinea, Ethiopia, Iraq, Israel, Nigeria, Pakistan, Somalia and Syria. These recommendations apply to residents of these countries prior to international travel and long-term visitors (staying more than four weeks) to these countries. The Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC) will continue to monitor the situation and inform the public as information becomes available. # Travel Advisory for the Hajj and Umrah

The Hajj is the largest annual gathering in the world. Almost three million Muslims attend this spiritual pilgrimage in Mecca, Saudi Arabia. The Hajj season will take place this year between approximately October 2 and 7, 2014. Umrah, a similar pilgrimage that can be carried out at any time of the year, is expected to be especially busy during the month of Ramadan (approximately June 28 to July 28, 2014). Due to the large number of people at these gatherings, there may be an increased risk for certain infectious diseases such as meningococcal disease, tuberculosis, influenza, and travellers' diarrhea. Travellers should also be aware of the Middle East Respiratory Syndrome Coronavirus (MERS-CoV), a virus identified in the Middle East that causes severe respiratory illness. Travellers may also face a greater risk of heat exhaustion, heat stroke and physical injuries.

### Request for Best Practices to Improve Healthcare Worker Influenza Immunization Rates

Thanks to your hard work and leadership, the provincial median healthcare worker influenza immunization (HCW II) coverage rate increased for the 2013-2014 flu season by 4.8% and 4% for hospitals and long-term care homes (LTCHs) respectively in Ontario. In order to build on this momentum, the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care (MOHLTC) plans to compile and share with health units, hospitals and LTCHs:

- 1. Creative approaches for increasing HCW II rates at the facility level (e.g. holding a facility wide competition for the department with the highest HCW II coverage rate); and
- 2. HCW II data collection best practices (MOHLTC analysis has shown that some facilities are still not capturing HCW II rates for certain staff categories – notably students, volunteers and other contract staff).

Once compiled and finalized, the MOHLTC plans to post these best practices and/or distribute them as a standalone document in addition to presenting them during an educational webcast in the fall.

### Health Care Workers Guide to Extreme Heat Events

A new, free, accredited one-hour e-module entitled "Health Care Workers Guide to Extreme Heat Events" can help professionals keep up-to-date on the current state of heat-health evidence. Developed by Health Canada in collaboration with McMaster University, the Ontario College of Family Physicians and the Clean Air Partnership, this guided course is available on demand.

The course is designed for public health professionals, physicians and nurses, as well as healthcare workers working with people most at risk: seniors, children, outdoor workers, the physically active, and people with cardiovascular, respiratory or mental illness. The successful completion of the course is worth 1.5 CME credits from the Canadian College of Family Physicians and/or Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons. ### **Breastfeeding Support Now Offered by Telehealth 24/7**

Breastfeeding mothers now have access to expert advice and support 24 hours a day, seven days a week through Telehealth Ontario. This free service is provided by Registered Nurses with additional training and education in breastfeeding. As with all Telehealth services, breastfeeding support is free, available in multiple languages, and has a direct number for those with hearing and speech difficulties.

# Ontario Health Profile: Infographics to Help Explain Important Public Health Issues

In March, Public Health Ontario (PHO) launched the Ontario Health Profile (OHP) to feature key public health issues. The purpose is to provide public health professionals with the information they need to take action. It includes ten infographics:

- Extreme weather
- Foodborne illness
- Mental health
- ObesityRadon

Measles

- Population health Respiratory viruses
- Road safety

• The first five years

These ten stories represent key public health issues that PHO determined were of interest to the public health sector in Ontario and meet the majority of the following criteria:

- have a significant impact on the population
- are changing, emerging or would benefit from attention
- are amenable to prevention
- contribute to a discourse on health inequities
- can be informed by available data
- support Ontario's Public Health Sector Strategic Plan ("Make No Little Plans")

The infographics are intended to provide public health professionals with health status information for planning and evaluation. They were designed to capture and explain important public health issues in innovative and user-friendly ways that help public health professionals tell the story of health and health status in the province. Infographics are available on the Public Health Ontario website in a downloadable pdf at *www.publichealthontario.ca* found under Data & Analytics section.

In addition to the infographics, two complementary products are in production for later in 2014: a web-based report with interactive data visualizations and explanatory text, as well as supplementary data tables at the public health unit level. Together, this suite of three products comprises the OHP.
