In preparation for the influenza season 2016/2017, the vaccine order form will be posted on Public Health's website at www.peterboroughpublichealth.ca under For Professionals / Health Professionals / Influenza.

Again, this year the province of Ontario will be offering a vaccine with enhanced effectiveness among elderly individuals to residents living in Long-Term Care Homes (LTCH). Fluad® is an adjuvanted trivalent inactivated influenza vaccine that is targeted to elderly populations 65 years of age and older. Priority will be given to those in Long Term Care Homes and the Hospital. The amount we receive will be staggered. Only 30% will be received at Peterborough Public Health the third week of September and the remainder are anticipated for mid-October. Therefore, distribution will also be staggered. The UIIP and Pneumococcal Immunization to High Risk Groups: There is considerable overlap in the indications for the influenza and pneumococcal polysaccharide vaccine. Because of this overlap, the annual influenza immunization program presents an excellent opportunity to immunize eligible persons who have not yet received <u>one</u> dose of pneumococcal polysaccharide vaccine. The pneumococcal vaccine may be administered concurrently with influenza vaccine, but at a separate anatomic site. All residents of nursing homes, homes for the aged and chronic care facilities or wards are eligible to receive the pneumococcal polysaccharide vaccine as part of the high risk program.

Adverse Vaccine Reactions following Immunization: As required under the Health Protection and Promotion Act, all adverse vaccine reactions need to be reported to Public Health using the Ontario Adverse Event Following Immunization Form. Please reference the <u>Public Health Ontario</u> website for more information and copies of the form.

Vaccine Fridge Inspections: All organizations prequalifying to participate in this influenza season must pass a vaccine fridge inspection. If you have not yet received an inspection, please contact Letisha Crombie at 705-743-1000 ext 309.

Vaccine Storage & Handling: According to the MOHLTC's Vaccine Storage and Handling Protocol, it is recommended that vaccine cooler temperatures are tracked during clinics. To assist in tracking vaccine cooler temperatures, a Temperature Log Sheet is available on the MOHLTC website. Maximum, minimum and current temperatures should be recorded when leaving your facility, after 1 hour of travel, when arriving at the clinic site, a minimum of every hour during clinic, at the clinic site before leaving, after 1 hour of travel, and finally, when arriving at your facility before putting vaccine back in the fridge.

Vaccine Clinics: Vaccine will be available at pharmacies and health care provider offices starting mid-October for the general public. One community clinic will be held in Millbrook in November. Peterborough Public Health will hold clinics once a month in November through January for children under 5 years of age and others wishing to book an appointment. Clinic dates will be posted soon at www.peterboroughpublichealth.ca.

Vaccine Distribution & Pick Up: Please complete our <u>Flu Vaccine Order form</u> and fax your order along with your vaccine fridge temperature log to Christine Lowe, at (705)743-2897. We will indicate the date flu vaccine is available for pick-up on our website.

Only order a <u>one week supply</u> of vaccine. The temperature log should indicate temperatures within the range of 2°C to 8°C for at least seven days before vaccine will be released. <u>If you cannot administer the vaccine within the next one week, please arrange a later date for vaccine pick-up to reduce the risk of losing vaccine in a cold chain failure. Please ensure sufficient space is available in the monitored fridge to accommodate the vaccine order. <u>Immediately report any fridge temperatures below 2°C or above 8°C – call 705-743-1000 ext 139 between 8:30 am to 4:30 pm or after hours leave a message at 705-760-8197 for on-call staff.</u></u>

Peterborough Public Health is open from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm Monday to Friday. For vaccine pick up, a hard-sided cooler with a min/max thermometer is required. Please ensure that it is properly cooled before pick up to shorten your wait time. If you wish to borrow a cooler for your clinics this season, please contact Christine Lowe at (705)743-1000 ext. 260.

Influenza Immunization Clinic Reporting Requirements (Vaccine Utilization Report Forms): Reporting the amount of vaccine administered at each clinic is a vaccine inventory management measure required by the province of Ontario. The Ministry requires reporting of each dose of influenza vaccine administered during flu clinics administered by your organization. The appropriate Vaccine Utilization Reporting Form should be completed and faxed to Peterborough Public Health no later than 10 days after the immunization clinic. The Vaccine Utilization Report Forms for non-reimbursable or reimbursable clinics are on the MOHLTC website. Please fax to the attention of Letisha Crombie at 705-743-2897.
