Reducing the Spread of Illness in Child Care

If illness is spreading in your facility, this resource can be used as a tool to ensure that your child care centre is taking the correct measures to reduce the spread of illness.

- Encourage frequent hand hygiene among staff and children. Assist children in proceeding through the six steps of proper handwashing.
- ✓ Increase access to hand hygiene stations throughout the facility. <u>Alcohol based hand rub (ABHR)</u> can be used when soap and water are unavailable. If ABHR is to be used on children, they must be supervised.
- Implement enhanced cleaning and disinfection practices for high touch surfaces. Ensure that disinfectants have a DIN. Reach out to your center's Public Health Inspector if you have questions regarding cleaning or disinfecting.
- ✓ Encourage use of <u>Screening Tool</u> by children and staff. If indicated, follow the additional requirements on the screening tool for masking recommendations.
- ✓ Open windows and move activities outdoors, when it is safe to do so.
- ✓ Encourage <u>respiratory etiquette</u>.
- ✓ Ensure masks are available to staff and to children who are able to wear a mask.
- ✓ Ensure Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) are available to staff and children.
- ✓ Keep masks on at all times except when eating in designated locations.
- ✓ When removing masks for eating or drinking, maintain 6 feet between staff and children when possible.
- ✓ Restrict group sensory activities.
