- 22-unit independent living residence in Parkdale.
- These bachelor, 1 and 2 bedrooms apartments are available to our Indigenous male clients
- O'Gitchidaa Mushkiki Wigwam provides a nice, spacious unit at a reasonable rent.
- The rents charged are below market rent levels, making it affordable to the men moving into the rental units.
- This long-term housing solution is safe and affordable.



# Barriers to building affordable housing in Toronto



- The time it takes to acquire building permits
- Build code variances that trigger Committee of Adjustment
- The harmful statutory community consultation
- The ridiculous notion of Heritage Conservation districts in Toronto where building designs have to be approved by the Heritage Conservation Board
- Operating vs owning the affordable housing

- 16 self contained one bed room units
- 1<sup>st</sup> floor will be completely accessible for tenants with disabilities
- On site superintendent
- Improved street appeal
- We plan to be good neighbours
- We have a vested interest in seeing our tenants be successful

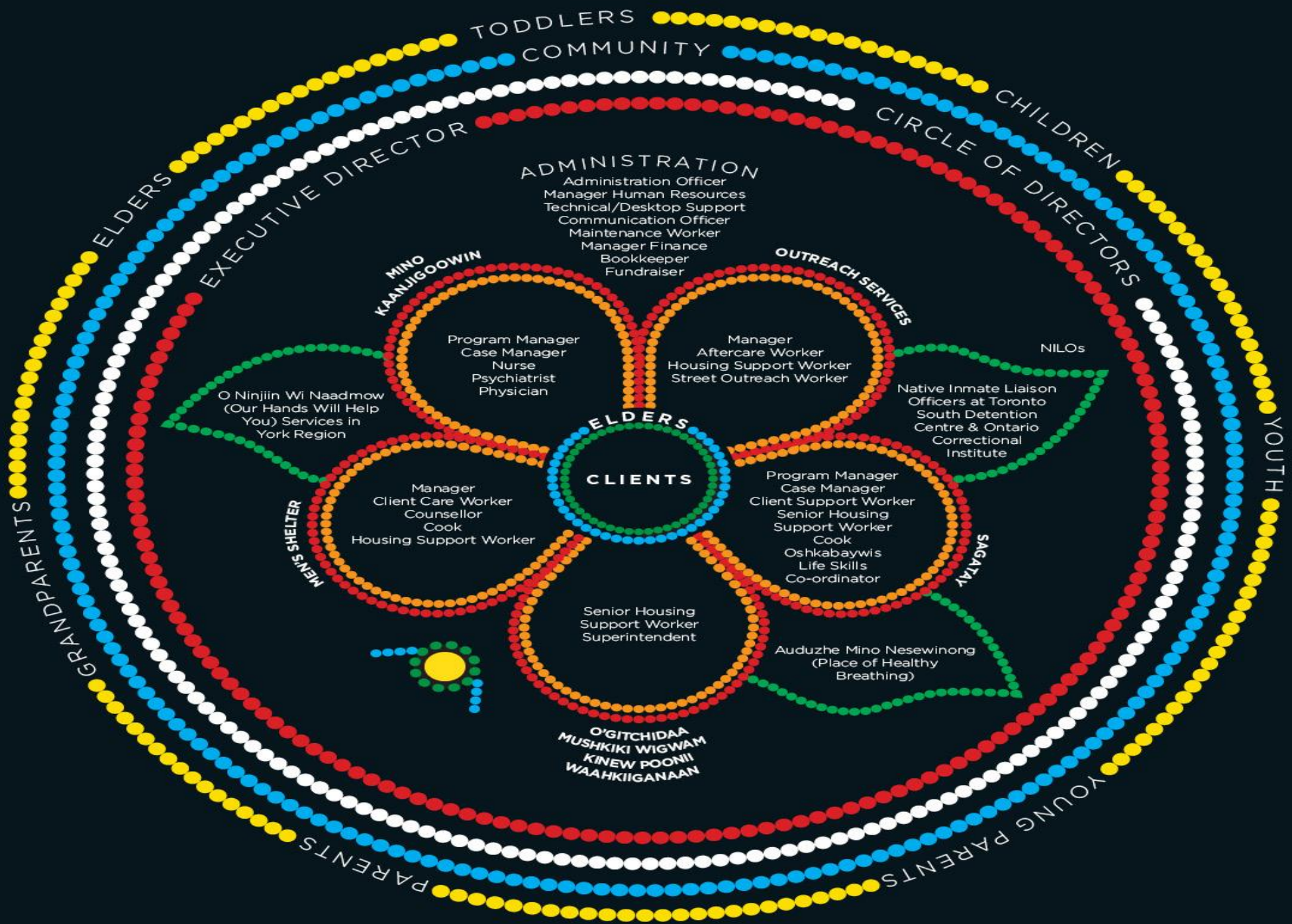

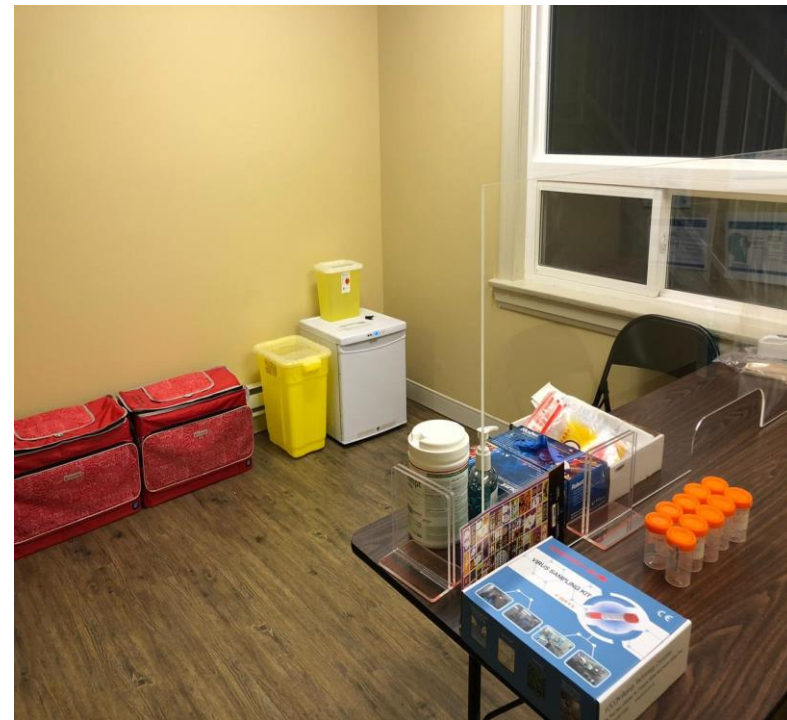
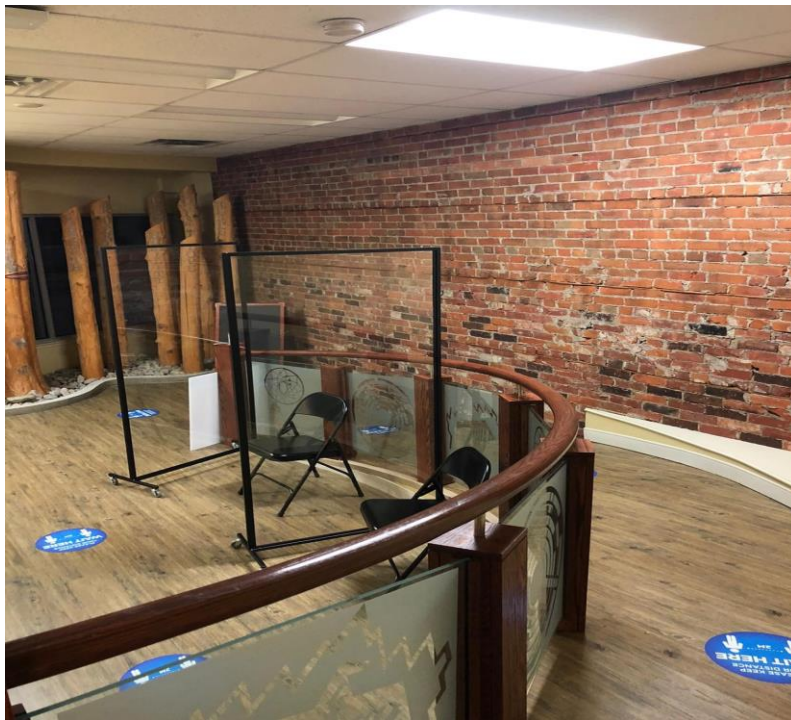
