Working to protect you and respond to the COVID-19 pandemic. Between **March 13 and May 15, 2020**, public health activities to protect the residents of the City and County of Peterborough, and Curve Lake and Hiawatha First Nation include...



73 cases of COVID-19 to date managed by public health nurses, including daily check-in calls.

100% of cases complied with public health measures.



300+ people identified, traced and advised they were a case or a close contact of a confirmed case of COVID-19.



20 local long-term care homes, retirement residences and the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph's had testing of their residents and staff completed in partnership with Community Paramedics and PRHC Assessment Centre staff.

4 outbreaks managed in local seniors' residences.



96 public health professionals

worked **21,400** hours from March 13 - May 8 to reduce the spread of COVID-19.



March 23, 2020

date when a COVID-19 community of practice launched for 52 local residential homes and community agencies serving older adults.



5,267 testing swabs distributed to local healthcare partners.

6,350+ local residents tested.



7,103 nursing assessments conducted by phone.

3,963 COVID-19 inquiries from residents and community partners handled.



460 tests coordinated by PPH with Peterborough Paramedics for residents who were unable to access an assessment clinic.



337,633 clicks/visits to COVID-19-related webpages.

63 daily situational reports on local case statistics.



63 seniors' residences consulted with to prevent or contain the spread of COVID-19, including long-term care and retirement homes, and other seniors' settings.



19 media briefings (and counting!).

51 media inquiries fielded.
